- 2nd place, Ken Ward, "Bombero" 30 lbs.

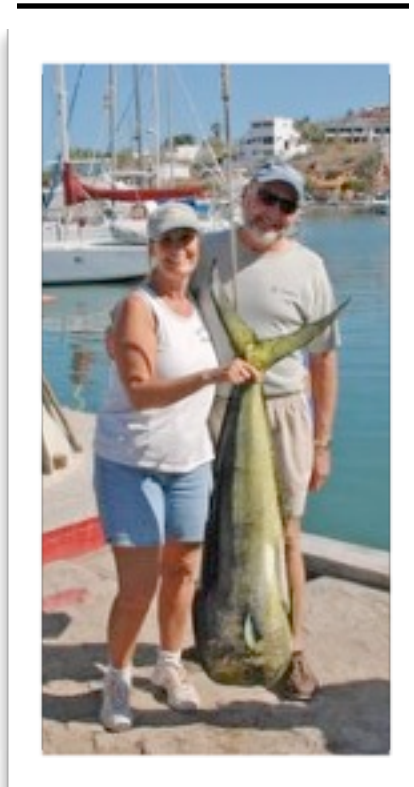
Biggest Game fish:

KINO'S SALICORNIA PROJECT REPORTED IN LOS ANGELES TIMES

The old man who farms with the sea

The crop is salicornia. It is nourished by seawater flowing from a man-made canal. And if you believe the American who is farming it, this incongruous swath of green has the potential to feed the world, fuel our vehicles and slow global warming.

He is Carl Hodges, a Tucson-based atmospheric physicist who has spent most of his 71 years figuring out how humans can feed themselves in places where good soil and fresh water are in short supply.

The founding director of the University of Arizona's highly regarded Environmental Research Lab, his work has attracted an eclectic band of admirers. They include heads of state, corporate chieftains and Hollywood stars, among them Martin Sheen and the late Marlon Brando.

Here in the northern Mexican state of Sonora, he's thinking much bigger.

Hodges sees opportunity. Why not divert the flow inland to create wealth and jobs instead of catastrophe?

"The only way we can stop [sea-level rise] is if people believe we can," said Hodges, whose outsize intellect is exceeded only by his self-assurance. "This is the big idea" that humanity has been waiting for, he believes.

We packed and distributed 317 backpacks for schoolchildren this past season. That includes ones that are being distributed at the Old Kino breakfast facility throughout the summer to children who have birthdays in a specific month. We have 29 left to begin our distribution in the fall and welcome your continuing support of this program when you return. However, it's important to remember that the supplies are just as important as the backpacks.

We have PLENTY of pencils and crayons on hand for next year, so instead of those items, we would like to ask you to concentrate on the things that we DO need and have '0' in inventory...these are **folders, coloring books (please NO activity books with all the directions in English, anything else is fine), pencil-top erasers, flat erasers, pencil sharpeners, rulers, scissors, glue (stick or bottle) and spiral notebooks (please no loose-leaf notebooks or loose-leaf paper..they don't use it).**

It's not necessary to pack the individual backpacks...just bring the supplies and we'll do the rest.
