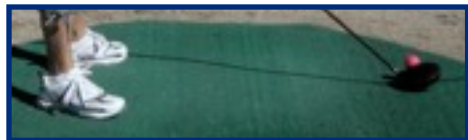

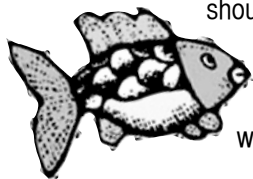

## WHAT WE DID THIS SUMMER!
