To Your Health...

This month I would like to cover several things that can help our retirement community when an emergency or serious illness happens.

Our First Responder Group is available to assist you in case of accidents or medical emergencies. Keep a copy of this list close to your phone or radio and make sure every one in your home knows who to call.

We will respond and after checking your condition, help you decide what action to take, whether it is going to the local clinic or calling Red Cross (Cruz Roja) to transport you to CIMA.

After my recent Cardiac event on Nov. 19th, I am a living testimonial for **CIMA hospital**. I am very impressed with this facility and the

Doctors and Nurses on staff there. There are many others in this community who have been a patient in CIMA that will back me up on assuring you that you will be in a top-notch hospital should it be necessary for you to go there.

The next important thing you need to do, in case the need arises that you be hospitalized, is take the time right now...before you have an emergency...to check your **insurance coverage**. For you 'younguns' under 65, that will be whatever medical plan you are using. For all the rest of us, it will be your Medicare Supplemental Insurance with whatever company you have selected for supplemental coverage. You will most likely find this information under "Foreign Travel - Not Covered by Medicare." For instance, in my case, my policy covers the first 60 days of each trip outside the USA. Fortunately, my heart attack occurred the day after we arrived but I had no idea that was the case with my insurance until this happened. I suggest you check your policy and determine what coverage you have during your stay in Mexico or anywhere else outside the US.

After the holidays, I will be organizing a **flu shot/hepatitis shot clinic**. If we have sufficient interest in this service, we will go forward with a clinic. The cost will be approximately 240 pesos for flu shots, and 540 pesos for hepatitis shots. If you need the hepatitis shot, please indicate whether you need the 1st, or the 2nd, or 3rd shot in this 3-shot series. Watch for a sign-up sheet in the club, and listen for the announcement shortly after the holidays. —RV

Rooster and his wife, Dora, were regulars in Kino for many years and made their home at KunKaak RV Park. Rooster was known and loved for, among other things, his outstanding work in the Club kitchen.

Survivors include wife Dora, son Ronald Clark of Yuba City, daughter Judith Goodman of Chico, brother Billy Dean Clark of Sacramento, sister Helen Teague of Yuba City, five grandchildren and seven great-grandchildren. He was preceded in death by son Marcus Clark.
