SCHOOL SUPPLIES

The Club's Community Outreach Program takes school supplies to the ejidos in the fall and

continues to resupply them as long as school is in session thru the spring. Items you can donate include: Backpacks, spiral notebooks, pens, pencils, pencil sharpeners, scissors (the type that can be used by either right or left-handed folks), glue (either sticks or bottles), colored pencil pkgs, colored folders, pencil-top or flat erasers, and rulers. Backpacks are the first priority.

Teachers request coloring books for the younger children; they need to be in Spanish. They are inexpensive and can usually be found in Dollar Stores, Family Dollar, Big Lots, etc., closer to the border.

Cocina de Sunshine

We are beginning another season full of activities in Kino Bay. Hello to all of you returning; and those who will not be returning—we will miss you.

I look forward to getting your recipes. You may either e-mail them (sunshinegb@earthlink.net) or give to me directly. Either way, please keep them coming as there are many months ahead to publish them in our *Kino News*. I would especially like something special for the holidays, so come on—send them to me!

This month comes from Jan Vala. She & Tom have been in Kino for about 14 years, coming from Portland, Oregon. Jan goes by "Portland Rose," or the alias "PoRo." Tom is "Turbo Jet," the same as little fuzzy T.J., my grandson! Jan & Tom love to travel, and I know Jan loves to play "May I" every chance she gets. They take a huge supply of seafood back to Oregon when they leave. Here is one of their favorite recipes:

COCONUT SHRIMP

1 to 1 1/2 lbs large shrimp	1 T Kosher salt
1 1/4 C flour, 1/2 C cornstarch	1/4 tsp. baking powder
1/2 tsp. sugar	1/4 tsp cayenne pepper
1tsp. each grated lemon & orange rind	4 C shredded coconut

Mix dry ingredients.

In small bowl mix 2 eggs, 6T orange juice & 1/2C milk. Whisk until smooth, add to dry ingredients. Whisk well

Spread 4C shredded coconut in shallow pan. Dip each shrimp in batter, shake off excess, dredge in coconut make sure all is covered well. Deep fry in 350 degree oil 1-2 min. Drain on paper towel. YUM!!! Then Tom makes a secret sauce, (no secret anymore Tom!): 6 T orange marmalade, 1 T horseradish, 2 tsp stone ground mustard, 2 T cream cheese, 1 tsp lemon juice, and a little cayenne. Blend until smooth and ENJOY!
